## Course Description

- SW11                    **Knowledge and Philosophical Foundations of the Social Work Profession**  
A generalist perspective: History, philosophy, values, principles and ethics with special reference to the profession's global standards and the Philippine social code of ethics, knowledge base/foundations of social work e.g. human behavior and social environment, social work practice including adaptation to cross-cultural settings, and social welfare, programs and services
- SW 12                    **Fields of Social Work**  
Exposure to and orientation on different social welfare/social work settings and contexts; social work roles and functions in working with different types of client systems, issues and concerns of social welfare/development agencies
- SW 13                    **Self and social awareness**  
The development of the professional self utilizing a module for building self awareness in intrapersonal and interpersonal relationships. Emphasis is on the development of the professional self through conscious awareness of one's self, values, attitudes and how these affect others and how these are shaped by socio-cultural forces.
- SW 21                    Filipino Personality and Social Work  
Concepts, theories and indigenous perspectives for understanding Filipino behavior and culture in relation to social work practice.
- SW 22                    Philippine Social Realities and Social Welfare  
Philippine economic, political, social and environmental realities in the context of the regional and global situation, and their effects on social welfare and social work.
- SW 23                    Social Work Communication and Documentation  
Concepts, methods, processes, techniques, skills, and tools for social work interviewing and recording
- SW 24                    Social Welfare Policies, Programs and Services  
Analysis of social welfare policies, programs and services of different stakeholders and institutions in the public and private sectors such as government agencies, non-governmental organizations, people's organizations, faith-based organizations, corporate foundations and their implications to social work practice.
- SW 25                    Social Environment and Social Work  
Traditional, alternative and emerging perspectives to understand children and families, groups, and communities: types, variations, structures, processes, and dynamics in the Philippine context; implications and relevance to social work.

- SW 26                      Social Change and Development Perspectives  
Critical analysis of social change, development and transformation theories, and good practices in development work with emphasis on their relevance and impact on developing countries (Prerequisite courses: Society and Culture, Economics and other social sciences)
- SW 30                      Social Welfare Agency Administration  
Theories, methods and processes of social welfare agency administration.
- SW 31                      Social Work Practice with Individuals and Families  
Theories, principles, methods, approaches and techniques in assessment and interventions in working with individuals and families
- SW 32                      Social Work Practice with Groups  
Theories, principles, methods, skills, and techniques in assessing and working with social groups
- SW 33                      Social Work Research 1  
Theories, concepts, processes and methods of research in social work
- SW 34                      Social Work Research 2  
Research practicum dissemination and utilization of strategies in social work.
- SW 35                      Social Work Counseling  
Basic counseling skills in social work practice.
- SW 36                      Social Work Practice with Communities  
Community organizing and community-based social work practice: Theories, principles, models, skills, and trends in community organizing; strategies in awareness raising, and community mobilization focusing on social entrepreneurship, advocacy and networking, corporate social responsibility.
- SW 37                      Social Work Statistics (Statistical analysis in social work)  
Concepts, principles, methods and application of statistics in Social Work research.
- SW 38                      Social Deviation and Social Work  
Socio-psychological perspectives on social deviation and implications to social welfare and social work.
- SW 39                      Social Work Community Education and Training  
Training design, strategies, and supervision for capacity building in social welfare.
- SW 40                      Social Welfare Project Development and Management  
Concepts, perspectives, processes, and tools for effective development and management of social welfare projects in the context of institutions, communities, and/or peoples' organizations in which social work operates.

- SW 41 A      Field Instruction I  
Placement in an institutional setting with particular focus on work with individuals, families and small groups.
- SW 41B      Field Instruction II  
Placement in a community-based setting with particular focused on working with a larger collectively (60-150 families) i.e. grassroots community.
- SW 42      Seminar on Current Trends in Social Work Practice  
Special topics on emerging trends in the different fields of social work practice focusing on the profession's responses to social issues and problems.
